

Requirements for articles

1.1. The article must be submitted in A4 format in electronic form (on disk or by e-mail). The electronic version is written in Microsoft Word or RTF format. Times New Roman Font. Line spacing – one and a half. The indentation is 1.5 cm. Field size – bottom, left, right – 2 cm, top – 2.5 cm. Pages must be numbered end-to-end. Use quotation marks "herringbone" in the text of the article.

1.2. The manuscript should be carefully checked and edited by the authors. At the same time, the material should be structured, presented clearly and consistently. The article should be signed by the authors.

1.4. The volume of the manuscript should not exceed 16 pages. By order of the editorial Board, larger articles can be published (including tables, references, figure captions, drawings), for informational publications and reviews – 1-5 pp., advertising – 0.5-1 pp. The volume of drawings should not exceed 1/4 of the volume of the article.

1.5. General arrangement of parts of the article and their design:

- UDC (font size 14, on the left edge).
- Article title (font size 14, bold, uppercase, on the left edge).
- Initials and surname of the author (s) (font size 14, bold). italic, left-aligned).
- Abstract (font size 12, length 100 – 250 words; it should include brief information about the goals, object and methods of research, brief results and conclusion).
- Keywords (7-10 words, font size 12, light italics, the words themselves – straight light font).
- Article text (font size 14). Type headings in the left margin, font size 14, bold. lowercase. Subheadings, if any, are typed into the text (font size 14, bold). italics). Text pages are numbered without gaps in continuous numbering should include all elements of the article; figures and tables are the authors of the text after the references; you are not allowed a blank article page; Acknowledgements (font size 14).
- The list of REFERENCES is made according to GOST R 7.05-2008 (font size 14). Numbers of literature sources (at least 7) are indicated as they are quoted in the text in square brackets, for example, [1-3], [7, 8]. you should cite more modern literature, including foreign ones, and avoid quoting poorly Accessible sources. The author is responsible for the correctness and completeness of the bibliographic data provided.
- Information about the author (12 font) or all authors (in full, without abbreviations), academic degree and position of each author, name of the institution where the work was performed and its postal address, email address (font size 12) in Russian. Article title (font size 14, bold, uppercase, left) in English. Initials and surname of the author (font size 14, bold). italics) and the title of the article in English (font size 14, bold. uppercase, on the left edge).
- Abstract in English (font size 12, volume 100 – 250 words; it should include brief information about the goals, object and methods of research, brief results and conclusion), keywords in English (font size 12, light italics, the words themselves – straight light).
- Keywords in English (12 font, bold italics)

- The list of references in English (font size 12, bold uppercase, centered) References is compiled in the same order as the list of references. Recommended online service-"Translit in Russian" (<http://translit.net>), where you need to select the BSI transliteration option.

References must be issued according to the following rules:

- Information about authors: Full Name of the author or all authors (in full, without abbreviations), academic degree, academic title, position of each author, name of the institution where the work was performed and its postal address, email address (font size 12) (in English). Design of figures and tables and formulas. Hyphenation in words should be done only in the text of the article hyphenation is not allowed in the title of the article, headings of all levels, names of tables and figures.

Tables and figures are numbered in the order of their mentioning in the text, each table and figure should have its own heading. The table title is highlighted in bold, and the font size is 14. Drawings are provided in Excel, Photoshop, and CorelDRAW formats. The resolution of drawings and photos in jpg or tif format must be at least 300 dpi. Drawings should be made sparingly, if they are made of separate elements, they should be grouped. Figure captions should be typed in plain text with a font size of 14; note to the figure – font size 10. Embedding larger images in the electronic original with their subsequent reduction by the "picture size" command is not allowed. The editorial Board has the right to request the authors to correct/correct the original illustrative material for the article in case of poor quality of the materials provided. References to formulas, figures, and tables are made using parentheses, for example, formula (3), equation (1), (Fig. 2), (table 7).

The only figure in the article (or the only table) should have only the title and not be designated as figure 1 (or table 1).

If the table does not fit on one page, then indicate "end of table 1", and on the next page – "continuation of table 1". Abbreviations. Only common abbreviations are allowed – names of measures, physical, chemical, and mathematical quantities, and terms, etc. All abbreviations must be deciphered, with the exception of a small number of common abbreviations. The names of institutions are given in full when they are first mentioned in the text, and the common abbreviation is given immediately in parentheses; when repeated references are made, the abbreviated name of institutions is given. Example: Udmurt state University (UdSU), re – UdSU.

Gratitudes. This section expresses gratitude to individuals, employees of institutions and foundations who have assisted in the research and preparation of the article, as well as indicates the sources of funding for research, if any.
